- ❖ **VALERIE ANDERSON - USA:** “June I wrapped up 30 years of overseas service as a school teacher and administrator. My last three years were spent in Tunisia, a country you have likely heard about in the news in recent months. Despite the reports of two horrific terrorist attacks, I hope those headlines have put Tunisia on the map for you. It breaks my heart that such a beautiful country is being destroyed by extremists! Please pray with me that in these dark times the Tunisian people will seek for true hope and peace and find it in a relationship with Jesus Christ. I am now transitioning to my new role as TCM Office Administrator. I have much to learn but am thankful for the opportunity to continue serving with TCM while also honoring my mother by being here for her. She has invested so much into my life and has been a terrific role model as a woman dedicated to the Lord and to bringing the gospel to the world. Please pray that the Lord will give me the skills and abilities I need for my new job and that He will be glorified through it.”



- ❖ **GARDNER & LEDITH IMPROSO -KENYA:** "We spent three months in the Philippines to attend the graduation of Keren and Kezia. They both completed degrees in International Studies after four years away from Kenya. June 9, we all landed back at JKIA (Jomo Kenyatta International Airport) whole again. While in the Philippines, we took opportunity to minister in church worships, youth and professional conferences and the Annual General Workers Conference by presenting challenges and rewards of commitment to mission and outreaches.

Another blessing was being reassured about Ledith's health. Part of our time was spent at doctors' clinics and laboratories due to a suspicious tumor-like growth in her uterus. All diagnosis shows nothing to be concerned about. All their opinions agree the growth will gradually dispose itself by hormonal changes.

A group of seven will participate in the *Africa Safari 2015* headed by Ben Anderson. Keren and Kezia will participate doing physical projects and spiritual outreaches in 10 short term days. The team will serve most in Embu Town and Mbeere of churches through church building, orphanage visit, seminars and evangelism."

- ❖ **PAT & MICHELLE KILGO:** "We have made several survey trips in the past few months to scout out some towns with sizable Chinese populations but no churches. We have a long range goal of reaching the northern quarter of this country with the gospel. Right now there is an area there about twice the size of Metro Atlanta, served by 5 churches total. It is a hard area to work in because most of the people belong to a group to which it is illegal to share Christ. However, the Chinese people are "eligible" to hear the gospel and we have found that many are eager to listen. The Chinese are mostly Buddhist, animists, or ancestor worshippers. There are many barriers to doing ministry in this part of the country. One barrier is the language - very few speak English and our Chinese is not yet up to par! Also this area is more rustic and away from urban centers thus difficult to minister in. I would ask each of you to pray that doors will open for the gospel to be shared."

- ❖ **JOHN COOK:** At the May 20th TCM board meeting John Cook was accepted as a missionary candidate to Southeast Asia. John is passionate about reaching Chinese people with the gospel. John accepted Christ as Savior in the Altoona Bible Church in Pennsylvania. He earned a Bachelor's degree from Grace Bible College and a Master's degree from Grand Rapids Theological Seminary. After working with Pat and Michelle Kilgo for one month John felt called to partner with them. He is currently traveling on deputation in preparation for a December 2015 departure. Reaching the lost and teaching the Bible to church members and pastors will be John's main ministry focus.
