They apparently had finished more paces than required for their level when they were still with a Philippine school.

At the end of January we are scheduled to be in the States to attend the winter missions conferences before going home to the Philippines. Would you please help us pray in advance that our schedules will go as planned? As we all know, we live in uncertain and dangerous times. Currently, traveling to the States from South Africa is prohibited. Unless the US opens up by early next year, we plan to go to another country from which we can travel to the States. We would have to stay in that country for at least 14 days before proceeding. Please help pray for these huge financial needs ahead of us, for health and safety in all our upcoming trips, and for wisdom to navigate these challenges and uncertainties. Despite these expected hardships, our hearts are full of joy just to think that we will see some of you, Lord willing, next year! We will do our best to visit as many of you as we can!

Not Two, but Three Vehicles

The first \$5000 for the ministry vehicles project came in March. We immediately started searching for a car and found a clean, low mileage Suzuki 2X4. While waiting for more funds to come, one of our Bible students from Lehae, who transports his fellow students to the Bible School in Boksburg, told us that he would sell his car to pay for the loan they used for his mother in-law's funeral. We thought that if the vehicle is gone, it will hinder our students' attendance at the Bible school. So, we decided to buy the car for a discounted price of \$2800. It is a good deal for a low mileage Toyota Yaris. The third car was harder to find. With \$2200 remaining, finding a reliable vehicle was a mission. After few weeks of searching, we decided to add another \$1400 to pay for a good Mitsubishi Lancer we had found. All three vehicles are now registered under GOMSA's name. Our three church planters are using them across their respective areas of assignment.

Finalizing the By-Laws, Asset Registry, and financial reports were on the agenda, in preparation for submitting the NPO annual financial report to the Department of Social Welfare and Development. Getting a new bank account with online and mobile capabilities for easier use was also proposed. The three ministry vehicles were also officially turned over to the National Board. A laptop and a printer were also donated to be used by the secretary and treasurer. On behalf of Things to Come Mission-USA, and our national counterpart, GOMSA, we want to thank you for your partnership and participation on these projects. May the Lord reward your faithfulness and generosity!

- 🔒 We thank the Lord for keeping us safe during the recent political and civil unrest in South Africa. The chaos started as a protest against the imprisonment of the former president Zuma, due to contempt after he refused to appear before the State Capture Commission, then escalated into acts of criminality and rebellion. Reports say that 161 malls and shopping centers, 11 warehouses, and 8 factories were looted and torched. A total of 337 people died due to the incidents. Our province of Gauteng and Kwazulu-Natal Province were the most affected. While the situation is under control, thanks to the heavy presence of the Police and South African Defense Force, the situation is still very volatile.
- 🔒 Please pray for our 3 church planters as they continue to find new opportunities to spread the gospel and open new preaching points and churches. Please pray for their health, protection, and financial sustenance. They are full-time workers and rely on very minimal financial aid.
- 🔒 We are grateful for the new outreach in Block-XX of Soshanguve. A regular Wednesday Bible study is conducted there by Pastors Mdluli and Chauke, at a church whose Pastor is a graduating student of our Bible school.
- 🔒 Please pray as we meet with some of our Bible students who are pastors of non-grace churches, to discuss how we could minister to their congregations and work together in the national ministry.
